Normus Urban Projects ensured that both of these objectives were achieved through their thoughtful approach to the construction of the dwellings at Swanport Rd, Murray Bridge.

When you live with a disability, access and being able to utilize the features of your home is critical. Normus understood that, and worked closely with experts and their trade people to produce a fantastic property.

Tenants can access their own light switches, without assistance, because Normus got the detail of the construction light switch dimension set-out right. Individuals can easily get in and out of their homes, by themselves, because the doorways are not only wide but Normus's attention to detail to get the door entrances perfectly flush were spot on. Tenants are proud of their homes because Normus built them in a way that incorporates their needs in a practical but subtle manner.

The newly constructed Murray Bridge homes have been developed for the Julia Farr Housing Association, which is a not-for-profit organisation located in South Australia. The Association is involved in the design and construction of progressive accessible housing developments which allow people living with disability to connect to their community. The Housing Association is also the landlord for a range of accessible community houses, and works with its tenants and their separate support agencies on accommodation matters. The Murray Bridge properties were developed with the support of the State Government of South Australia.
